Sherry Gary, President, called the meeting to order at 10:03 a.m. Sherry welcomed all members, new members and guests. Jackie Ruffing will be the Chairman of the Nominating Committee for 2022-2023. Please let Jackie know if you would like to serve. The Shreveport Guild will be here on May the 12 to show their raffle quilt and sell tickets. We will have a new approach to the Hive by having a buddy system for new members. Corey Starkey will be in charge of this new venture. We need a 2023 Quilt Show Chairman and a 2024 Raffle Quilt.

President – Sherry Gary - The March General Meeting minutes were approved as distributed in the newsletter.

Treasurer – Cecilia Brannon - The Financial report was posted in the lobby. Any questions should be addressed to Cecilia.

1st Vice President – Corey Starkey - Corey has put together a committee to help friend the newcomers. The Child Advocacy Center sent a thank you card for the pillowcases that were donated. Corey will be teaching scrappy strip pieced 6-pointed star tomorrow.

2nd Vice President – Cathy Woodson – Nancy Gibson presented her program called Secrets to Successful Miniatures. She will conduct a workshop right after Guild meeting. Our May program and workshop will be led by the Bee Creative small group. Their program is called You Don't Have to Be an Artist to Make an Art Quilt. Their workshop on Friday will show us many ways to enhance our quilts through coloring, inking and embellishments. Susie Bruise will show how to make clay buttons. In June we will have another zoom presentation. Jody Parron will inform us of Barn Quilts Trails. Two of these trails are found in Texas. One is around Lufkin and the other near Bonham. The workshop in June will be Rhonda Chapman showing us how to paint a barn quilt. Her husband is preparing the boards for this class which will cost \$10.00 plus the \$20.00 for the workshop. July is the Cuddle Quilt Challenge along with invited charity organizations telling the membership about their organization. The workshop will be presented by Lisa Martin on how to work with wool. Kit fee is \$12 and the workshop is \$20.

Quilt Show 2022 – Susan Merrill – Reported \$15,000 profit. Door prizes given by our venders were distributed to those that were at the preview party. Susan thanked all the members that helped make the show a success.

Susan Kellam has the ribbons for the quilt challenge. Next month will be the drawing for the blocks.

May- Bee Creative group

You Don't have to be an Artist to make an Art Quilt

What is an art quilt? How is it different from a modern quilt? This program will show those of us who are not art quilters how to step out of our traditional zone and see quilts from a different angle. We will also be having a *demonstration* of various techniques used in art quilting. Sounds very interesting!

Workshop- Step outside the box, embellish your quilts! In this **fun** workshop you have <u>3 different flower choices</u>. We will learn about using inks to *color fabric*, *embellishment* stitches, fabric beads and even making *clay buttons*! Cost is \$20. See complete supply list at QGETX.org.

Barn Quilts & Barn Trails

You may have seen wonderful, large quilt blocks painted on signs and hung on barns and other buildings in the past. Suzi Parron has researched and written books about the Quilt Trail Movement which began in 2001 by visiting 29 states. We have 2 Barn Quilt Trails in our area. One around Lufkin and one in the Bonham area. I'm sure you will find this to be a fascinating topic with great pictures and background information. The presentation will be via Zoom.

QGET PROGRAMS AND WORKSHOPS

Programs are offered the second Thursday of each month following the QGET business meeting at First Christian Church, Tyler. There is no charge to attend a program. The business meeting begins at 10am and the Program generally starts around 11. Programs last 1-1.5 hours.

Workshops vary in length from 1/2 day to a full day. They are held on the second Friday of the month. Workshops are generally \$20 for members who sign up at the meeting the day before the workshop. Please note that these doors lock automatically and you may have to go around to the main entrance to this building to get in. When we have full day workshops, you are responsible for your lunch. 

Thread Painting Supply List for the demonstration:

- 12" quilt sandwich, light solid color cotton, cotton batting, safety pinned together
- Air erase pen or other marker
- Thread: rayon or poly, choose light to dark values of an analogous colorway, 8-10 spools and black thread
- Sewing machine able to drop the feed dogs, free motion foot
- Optional 6-8 embroidery hoop
- Machine needles, 90/14
- Paper and pencil to take notes

If you just come and check us out, watch, take notes and enjoy the fellowship.

June ----- Hand Applique/Prepared Edge Applique by Lisa Martin

July ------Sue Olson will show us how to make a Steampunk block, AKA a Propeller block. If you are interested, there is a pattern you can purchase, Jen Kingwell is the designer. She will demonstrate how she made the Steampunk/Propeller block.

August----- Rose Wilson will demo Cathedral Windows.






Summing Up the Awards in Our 2022 Quilt Show

The foundation of our 2022 quilt show dates back to 2020, when a worldwide pandemic caused our quilt show to be cancelled. At that time many individuals and sewing groups had generously sponsored ribbons for the show. Those individuals and sewing groups graciously allowed their contributions to be carried over for two years.

During those two years of cancelled shows, much had changed. Our traditional venue was razed and the new one was smaller. We had to be extremely cost-conscious, so the decision was made to omit a quilt show program. Ordinarily the sponsors of ribbons are written up in the quilt show program, but this was no ordinary year. Additionally, the quilt show categories were different in 2022. Please rest assured that whether your category was combined with another, your ribbons were available to be awarded to winners.

To everyone who rallied to sponsor ribbons back in 2020 and who let their contributions carry over for two years—a heartfelt thank you for your understanding, support, and generosity. <u>Best Adaptation of Show Theme</u> - This ribbon will be awarded by the show judge to the quilt that best expresses the theme, "Ruby Red Celebration – 40th Anniversary." *Quilters Guild of East Texas*

<u>Exemplary Machine Quilting Award—Home Stationary</u> - A special ribbon will be awarded by the show judge to the quilt exhibiting the finest execution of a quilting stitch and an artistic design that is complementary to the quilt top. <u>Cecilia Brannon</u>

<u>Exemplary Machine Quilting Award—Track Mounted</u> - A special ribbon will be awarded by the show judge to the quilt exhibiting the finest execution of a quilting stitch and an artistic design that is complementary to the quilt top. <u>Bobbie Ashley</u>

<u>Exemplary Piecing Award</u> - A special ribbon will be awarded by the show judge to the quilt demonstrating the most accurate, pristine, and exacting standards of piecing. <u>Nancy Gibson</u>

<u>Exemplary Appliqué Award</u> - A special ribbon will be awarded by the show judge to the quilt demonstrating the most accurate, pristine, and exacting standards of appliqué. <u>Jackie Ruffing</u>, <u>Southern Star Quilting</u>

<u>Members' Choice Award</u> - Members of the Quilters Guild of East Texas vote for their favorite quilt during the Thursday evening preview party. The winner will receive a special ribbon and a \$50 cash award underwritten by the *Quilters Guild of East Texas*.

<u>Viewers' Choice Award</u> - Visitors attending the show vote for their favorite quilt. The winner will receive a special ribbon and a \$50 cash award underwritten by the *Quilters Guild of East Texas*.

Quilts, No Size Limitations, Quilted by any Technique

- Art Quilt: An Art Quilt is <u>an original design</u> which does not use commercial patterns or previous works. Design may include but is not limited to a naturescape; a pictorial; an exploration of a concept, experience, or shape; an experiment in the creative process; an original evolution of a traditional design; and/or an experimental use of non-traditional media.
- Modern: Characteristics of modern quilts may include, but are not limited to, the use of bold colors and prints, high contrast, graphic areas of solid color, improvisational piecing, (design) minimalism, expansive negative space, and/or non-traditional layouts.
- Other Techniques: Examples of Other include, but are not limited to, whole cloth, yo-yo, crazy quilt, digital imagery, and surface design techniques such as embroidery (by hand or machine), thread painting, surface painting, etc.
