QUILTERS GUILD OF EAST TEXAS

The Quilters Guild of East Texas met at First Christian Church on Thursday, August 11, 2022.

The Business meeting of the Guild was called to order at 10:02 a.m.

Sherry Gary, President, welcomed all members and guests.

The July General Meeting minutes were distributed in the newsletter. President Gary asked for corrections. Hearing none, the minutes stand approved as distributed.

Cathy Woodson introduced a ZOOM meeting with Eleanor Burns. Eleanor portrayed Nancy Page, which was the pen name of Florence La Ganke Harris who wrote quilting newspaper columns in the 1920s and 1930s. Eleanor show newspaper articles of the patterns and pictures of women in period dress showing quilts. She was assisted by a helper she called Lois. Pictures of The Grandmother's Garden quilt blocks were shown. Eleanor then demonstrated how to fuse applique pieces, then showed the zigzag and the blanket stitches for sewing the edges of the fused pieces. She noted the applique pieces she sent to Cathy would be applied to a 7.5 inch background fabric. As there were no questions from the audience the Zoom session was closed.

Announcements

Programs & Workshops

I would like to express my deepest gratitude to all our individual members and Bees for the wonderful programs we have had over the past year. We are blessed to have such gifted members willing to contribute to our Quilt Guild. Your creativity and talents are greatly appreciated! I look forward to the programs in the coming year.

September- Trish Stuart

In September *Trish Stuart* will be talking to us about pushing boundaries by making simple changes or additions to inspire and energize our work. She will talk to us about her design work making collages, painting, and thread painting. We will have an inspiring showing of her quilts using different techniques.

Workshop- Grow a hummingbird Garden

The workshop is a *collage* in which participants will create a sky and streaming stems, flowers will be fussy cut, fused and stitched down. Next will be cutting out the hummingbird and learning how to layer to get the depth and movement. The hummingbird will then be stitched to the sky area. *Your kit will include the materials needed for the top of the project and pattern instructions. 
Susan Merrill and Rhonda Chapman will begin sending **Vendor** letters this month. I have received several inquiries for vending at our 2023 Show.



GOT QUILTS????

Ladies, have you ever made a quilt that ended up all by itself, sitting in a corner, waiting to keep someone warm? I know I have, up until I found a worthwhile cause.

As you know, Ukraine is in ruins in many areas of their country. That led to thousands of Ukrainian families to flee with bare necessities, only items that they could carry. Additionally, thousands of orphans were relocated to Poland and other countries.

It's going to get cold in that part of Europe soon, so I'm asking for your talent and kindness to make a quilt for a child. It doesn't need to be fancy. It just needs to be warm. Typically, to speed up the process, rag quilts using flannel on both sides would work just fine. Rag quilts need no quilting, because it's a quilt-as-you-go method. Of course the decision is up to you.

Please think about this mission and request. Any size is acceptable, but as a rule, the length would be 50 to 65 inches, and the width 40 to 46 inches. I have some fabric and will be happy to bring it to the next Guild meeting, or drop it off to you. If you have any questions please don't hesitate to email me at the address below.

If you can make one, two, or any at all, that will make a child warm and happy. Quilts For Ukraine is an ongoing effort in conjunction with Quilts Without Borders. It will be an ongoing contribution until further notice. Currently there is no deadline.

Thank you all for considering this worthy need and cause for Ukraine.

The QGET Quilts of Valor group restart meeting will be held Monday, September 12, 10:00 a.m. at home of Pat Graham. All those interested in assisting us make or secure quilts for veterans please join us. Decisions will be made as to how often we meet and or sew, who is willing to make a whole quilt, piece only, quilt – long armers needed, bind, what kind of labels we use, sew labels on, write thank you cards, whether we make bags/pillowcases to store quilt, each person willing make certain blocks to put together in a quilt, make kits, help with awarding the quilts, and anything else we need to decide in order to honor as many of our veterans as possible. As you can see there are a multitude of opportunities to assist us in how we go about this worthwhile charity project.

A Quilt of Valor[®] (QOV) is a quality, handmade quilt that is machine or hand quilted. It is awarded to a Service Member or Veteran who has been touched by war. The Quilt says unequivocally, "Thank you for your service and sacrifice in serving our nation." To use the term Quilt of Valor, Quilts of Valor or QOV, the quilt must be a specific size, must have a label with required information, it must be awarded (it is not a gift) and it must be recorded.

What Does a Quilt of Valor Mean?

This quilt brings you a three-part message from our hearts.

- 1. We thank you for your service
- 2.Our quilters know that freedom is not free.
- 3. This quilt is meant to offer comfort to you.

A Quilt of Valor is not a charity quilt. A Quilt of Valor is not a blanket. Our quilts are awarded, not just handed out like a magazine or a video. This Quilt of Valor unequivocally says thank you for your service and sacrifice in serving our nation.

If you are a quilter, you know a quilt consists of three layers held together by it quilting stitches.

Quilts of Valor

Quilts = Healing!

We like to think of the layers in this way:

- 1. A top of the quilt with its many colors, shapes, and fabrics, represents the communities and the many individuals we are.
- 2. The batting, the filler, is the center of the quilt, its warmth. It represents our hope that this quilt will bring warmth, comfort, peace, and healing to the individual who receives it.
- 3. The backing is the strength that supports the other layers. It represents the strength of the recipient, the support of his or her family, our communities and our nation.
- 4. Each stitch that holds the layers together represents love, gratitude, and sometimes the tears of the maker.
- 5. Each Quilt of Valor is formed by loving hands that join bits of fabric together one piece at a time.

Quilt Requirements

- A Quilt of Valor does not have to be red, white and blue, but patriotic colors are very popular with recipients. Panels can provide a great focal point and bring in other colors. Think creatively with the recipient in mind.
- Recommended size: 60" x 80"; minimum: 55" x 65"; maximum: 72" x 90".
- The Quilt consists of a top, batting, and backing. It must be machine or hand quilted. A tied quilt is not acceptable for a Quilt of Valor.

• Use quality, adult-appropriate, 100% cotton, quilt-weight fabrics. Avoid juvenile prints and branch-specific fabric unless the recipient is known.

- Patterns and blocks can be of any design suitable for a patriotic theme.
- Use quality, 100% cotton; backings provided to Longarm Volunteers must be 8" wider in width and 8" longer in length. Wide commercial backings sold at quilt and fabric stores are acceptable. Square up, press and fold backing neatly before providing to quilter.
- Use quality, low loft batting such as cotton, cotton blends, polyester or polyester blends.
- Double fold, also known as French fold, is recommended for durability. Hand stitch or neatly machine stitch binding, mitering all corners.
- The label must state quilt is a Quilt of Valor in order to be awarded as a Quilt of Valor and recorded as such.

• Wash quilt once completed so it is soft and so that any potential fabric dye bleeding issues are resolved. Use cold water, mild detergent and unscented products. A color catcher will capture fabric dyes in washer.

• A thank you note, card or letter to the recipient may be included. A journal with information about how the quilt was made, maker's thoughts, etc. may be included.

Houston International Quilt Show Bus Trip - November 3, 2022.

QGET CHRISTMAS PARTY – December 8th, 2022. Season of Service & Giving

Children's Advocancy Center is the focus of our giving this year. Our program will feature Deanna Sims the Chief Development Officer of CAC. She will give us a video tour of their amazing facility and share what happens when a child is removed from the home.

Our Show and Tell will be a parade of all the items you have made and brought for donation to the Very worthwhile organization. Some suggestions are:

- 1. Lap quilt for boy or girl age 2 to 18


