QGET Minutes

First Christian Church – January 12, 2023

The meeting was called to order by 1st Vice President Cindy Newland at 10:00 AM. President Sherry Gary was absent due to illness. Guests and new/returning members were welcomed.

<u>Announcements</u> – Cindy explained the President was ill so she was filling in for the conduction of the meeting. The members were thanked for making two bags of quilts which were donated to the Children's Advocacy Center (CAC) in Tyler. A card from CAC was read to the members giving thanks for the donation.

The minutes of the December General meeting was posted in the newsletter. Additions or corrections were queried. Hearing none, the minutes stand approved as printed in newsletter.

<u>Treasurer Report</u> – The Treasurer's report is posted in the lobby. Any questions should be directed to Sheryl Moore, Treasurer.

<u> 1^{st} Vice President</u> – **Cindy Newland** – The HIVE will have a demonstration of making rope bowls and a variety of rope bowls will be shown. A workshop on making rope bowls will be held on Friday from 10:00AM to 1:00PM. Members can sign up after the meeting. The HIVE meeting in February will be how to

make a Design Wall and in May a demonstration of paper piecing is planned. In April there will be a Thursday afternoon workshop instead of the HIVE meeting.

<u>2nd Vice President</u> – **Mitzy Pearson** – Upcoming speakers scheduled are January – Cathy Woodson speaking on antique quilts and a trunk show of antique quilts. February speaker is Tiffany Hayes, a pattern designer and teacher. The lecture will include her trunk show and the workshop will feature her quick and easy technique for making a quilt. In March Marilyn Hardy will speak on American Scrap Quilts and give a trunk show of scrap quilts. No workshop is planned as this is month for quilt show. In April Anna Maria Horner will give a lecture on Blueprint Quilting. Thursday afternoon will be a half day workshop on Hand Applique. Friday will include an all day workshop on Cross Country Quilt featuring patchwork and applique. Kits will be available for the workshop. Cost for workshop is \$75.00 and information for workshop will be posted on website.

<u>Membership</u> – **Letha Sparks** – Sixty six people attended today's meeting. Current membership is 147 members and 5 new or renewed members signed up today. One guest attended and was introduced.

<u>Quilt Show</u> – **Cecilia Brannon** – We have 21 vendors, ribbons have been ordered, Ribbon/category sponsorships are attained. Members were encouraged to sell raffle tickets. There are 45 entries and final date to enter a quilt is the February meeting. Challenge animal entries were called for. Items due March 21 during quilt intake. Silent auction items were requested and a form is required with a picture of the item. Silent Auction items are due March 9. Country Store will be headed by Lisa Martin. She will have a work day to organize and price items on January 23, 10 AM at her home.

<u>Event Coordinator</u> – **Pat Graham** – The Dallas Quilt show bus trip on March 10 has 19 people signed up and 21 more are needed or cost must be increased. Cost is \$55.00 and includes a ticket to the show. January Greenbriar Retreat has openings. Cost is \$318.00.

<u>Community Projects</u> – **Susan Branscum** – From October 1 to December 31, 2022 there were 1148.5 volunteer hours reported. Cuddle Quilts donated 11 quilts to Kaufman County Children's Center in December. Susan asked members to save and turn in UPC labels from Hobbs Batting packages so that batting can be purchased at a reduced price through their charity program. Lisa Martin and Cory Starkey donated 35 pillowcases to the Child Advocacy Center and were sent a thank you note.

<u>Bee Keeper</u> – **Maressa Campbell** – Open Bees were reported and contact person for bee identified.

<u>Sunshine and Shadow</u>s – **Rhonda Chapman** – A sheet will be placed at main table each general meeting and request was made for members to write down S&S information on the sheet. Susan Branscum's father passed away. Sherry

Gary has covid. A relative visiting Rhonda Chapman fell and broke both wrists. She showed a Deal or Dud pen available on Amazon for 87 cents to \$1.25.

<u>Reception</u> – **Kathy Burns** – Door prizes donated by Joyful Threads and Options Quilt shop were awarded. Jan Glover told about a library project named Story House Quilts and explained volunteer needs for the project. The guild has been involved with this project since 2012 and volunteers are needed to take the quilts to area libraries.

Mitzy Pearson introduced the speaker Cathy Woodson. Antique and vintage quilts in her collection from 1800s to early 1900s were shown and a history of the quilt provided. The program finished with a demonstration on how to fold quilts for storage.

Show and Tell included tops made at the Quilt of Valor work day at Pat Graham's home. Cuddle quilts donated today were shown as well as beautiful quilts made by members. Cathy Woodson asked members with antique quilts to allow them to be shown at the Goodman museum show featuring antique quilts. Yvonne Munn asked for donation quilts for Camp V veterans.

Meeting closed at 11:55AM.


