The Quilters Guild of East Texas met at First Christian Church on Thursday December 9, 2021. Sherry Gary, President, called the meeting to order at 10:02 a.m. Sherry welcomed all members, new comers and visitors to the Guild meeting.

President - Sherry Gary reported the November minutes were printed in the newsletter and asked if there were any additions or corrections. The minutes are approved as printed.

Treasurer - Cecilia Brannon - The financial report was posted in the lobby. Any questions should be addressed to Cecilia.

1st Vice President – Corey Starkey – Corey will have a pillowcase pattern for the membership to make pillowcases for foster children/children in crisis. The Hive will also have other upcoming projects to entice everyone to come.

2nd Vice President- Cathy Woodson – Today was our Christmas luncheon! Before our sack lunch there was a wonderful Show and Tell of beautiful red and green and Christmas quilts by the members. We played Quilt-O and had homemade cookies provided by your Board members!

January's program will be provided by Piecemakers small group. It will be an innovative program with a surprise ending! Bring an orphan block or two to contribute to the program. Any size, any color and any technique. Sandra Sims will teach Ricky Tims's "Harmonic Convergence" technique workshop on Friday. Supply list is on the website.

February will be a Zoom presentation by Teresa Wong, Big Love Texas Cotton and Quilts. There will also be a discussion of the Sesquicentennial Quilt Search that the Quilters Guild of East Texas participated.

March, in addition to Quilt Show announcements, we will have a display and discussion of antique sewing implements and sewing machines from the collections of members.

Membership – Lisa Martin - We have 45 members here today.

Social Media – Jackie Ruffing – Domain with Go Daddy has been paid and we are good for another year. We are up to date.

Newsletter – Lucinda Cox - If you are not getting the newsletter via email, please let Lucinda know.

Bee Keeper - Karen Walters – Community Service- Beginning in January, all Volunteer hours will be on one sheet. Maresa will have this at the Cuddle Quilts table. This is for the Guild's 501 (c) (3) status.

Cuddle Quilts – Maresa Campbell – Took in 7 completed quilts, two tops and backs. Gave 20 quilts to the Children's Advocacy Center of Smith County, 20 quilts to the First Baptist Church Family Assistance Center for the SOS Program which provides for the homeless and those that have lost their homes due to disaster. Also 21 quilts were donated in conjunction with the Christian Quilt Guild. Making a total of 100 quilts to go to the Salvation Army.

On Friday, December 10, 2021, the Cuddle Quilt Bee has planned a social. They will meet at the Red Dome in Quitman for lunch at 11:30 and then shop at Stitching Heaven.

The next Cuddle Quilt meeting is January 18th. They meet at the First Baptist Church in Tyler.

Cuddle Quilts will host a challenge next year. They will provide panel quilt kits for anyone that wants to join. Make your quilt out of the kit for Cuddle Quilts. In July there will be a show off contest for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place. Pick up your kits in January.

Deal or Dud – Sheryl Moore – From a Fons and Porter show they showed how to make a pin cushion by stuffing cotton with batting and then stuff the ends down the middle of the spool. Need to ship something, you can use all your little clippings and scraps for packing instead of using plastic.

Quilt Show 2022 – Cecilia Brannon – We are going to have a quilt show! Get your quilts in and make sure you are using the new form. Maggie McGuire will be doing the silent auction and will be adding baskets. Check with Maggie for needed items. Challenge Blocks need to be done as they are judged and given away. The vendor list is almost full. Volunteer sign-up sheets will be posted in January, please sign up. We are going to have fun!

Lisa Martin asked that you bring your Country Store donations to the Boy Scout room before the Guild meetings beginning in January.

What fun we had in December! Thank you all for the generous participation in the Christmas Show & Tell. What a great guild we have. It was also wonderful to see all the completed Scandinavian Snowflake projects. Just beautiful! The fabric was flying around the room during Quilt-O and some lucky members took home a big haul of fabric.

January's program will be provided by the *Piecemakers* small group. They will provide a fun and creative program using **orphan blocks**. This requires **audience participation**. **Please bring an orphan block** in January. Any size, any kind of block. We all have those blocks that were extra or were class projects. They will be incorporated into a quilt.

Just in case we have more blocks than needed, put your name on your blocks and we will return them to you. If you do not want them back, they will be donated to the Country Store or Cuddle Quilts. *You will be entertained and amazed in January!*

Sandra Sims will teach Ricky Tim's "*Harmonic Convergence*" technique in a workshop on Friday January 14th. We have all heard of him and seen his innovative work but I have not taken one of his classes. I am signed up and ready learn his technique! The supply list on our **QGETX.org** website is short and simple. There are 2 samples using different types of fabric to see at our Guild meeting.

February- We will have a guest speaker via ZOOM, *Theresa Wong*. **Big Love, Texas Cotton & Quilts** Texas grows *6 million acres* of cotton, the most in the United States. Her lecture will present the *big love between Texas cotton and Texas quilters*. She will discuss *20th century masterpieces* made by Texans including tracing the quilts which hung in the *Texas Capitol rotunda in 1986* following the **Texas Quilt Search**. The Quilters' Guild of East Texas participated in that quilt search and Marilyn Hardy will share some of her memories of that experience. There will be no workshop.

QGET PROGRAMS AND WORKSHOPS

Programs are offered the second Thursday of each month following the QGET business meeting at First Christian Church, Tyler. There is no charge to attend a program. The business meeting begins at 10am and the Program generally starts around 11. Programs last 1-1.5 hours.

Workshops vary in length from 1/2 day to a full day. They are held on the second Friday of the month. Workshops are generally \$20 for members who sign up at the meeting the day before the workshop. Cost may vary with the length of the workshop. Workshops begin at 9am. Participants are encouraged to arrive by 8:30 to set up machines and supplies if necessary. Workshops are in the conference room at First Christian Church, Tyler. This room is located in the building behind the main sanctuary building. It is next to the scout room by the doors that lead out into the parking lot between the two buildings. Please note that these doors lock automatically and you may have to go around to the main entrance to this building to get in. When we have full day workshops, you are responsible for your lunch. You may bring a lunch or order from one of the restaurants close by.



Country Store Recommended Price List 2022

Magazines – Do not need to be priced, will be .25 each or 5/\$1.00.

Books – NO BOOKS ACCEPTED AT THIS TIME. If you have a fantastic, current book you'd list to donate please contact Lisa Martin and we can sell it another way.

Fabric, Yardage – Measure your fabric, then roll it and put masking tape around the roll. Write the yardage or, if it is an odd size, the measurements on the masking tape and the price. Price is \$1.00 to \$3.00 per yard based on the age and quality of the fabric.

Fabric, Fat Quarters – No need to price Fat Quarters, they will all be in a bin for .50 or \$1 each. However, please inspect your fat quarter to make sure it is a complete fat quarter!

Fabric, Scraps – Please donate only usable scraps. Once we receive them we will sort them by color and put in gallon zipper bags. If you would like to help us out you can sort yours in advance! Otherwise just give them to us in gallon zipper bags. They will be displayed in bins and priced between \$1 and \$3.

Fabric, Layer Cakes and Jelly Rolls - \$10 to \$15 each, depending on age and size.

Patterns and Kits – Old clothing and bag patterns - .50, Embroidery/cross stitch patterns - .50 to \$1.50, Old Quilt patterns - \$1, Current Quilt Patterns - \$2 to \$10 (higher prices for well known designers), Patterns with templates - \$5 to \$10. For Kits that include fabric and or thread double the price of the pattern by itself. Use your judgement on how much you think people would pay.

Sewing Notions –

Small packages of lace, store bought binding, etc – just put in small zipper bags and we will price Decorator Fringe or Large bolts of lace - \$2 to \$4, depending on how much is on the bolt. Put it in a bag and mark the yardage and price.

Small notions – seam rippers, scissors, tape measures, pins, needles, etc. .50 to \$3.

Quilt Rulers - \$2 to \$15, depending on size and condition.

Batting - \$1 to \$5. Bundle pieces large enough to be sewn together, put in a 2 gallon zipper bag and price it. Larger full quilt sizes should be priced higher.

Hand Quilting Frames - \$5 to \$25

Quilt Tops - \$3 to \$25, depending on the size, age, and quality.

Quilt Blocks - \$1 to \$20, Put in a 1 or 2 gallon zipper bag. Label the number and size of blocks, the price should reflect the number of blocks. Please press them in advance.

New Items - .50 to \$25, Items made for the Boutique area should be priced based on complexity and what you think others will pay for them. We may move your item to the Silent Auction if we think it would be more appropriate there.

Your Country Store Committee reserves the right to change prices on the items you donate if we don't think your price is appropriate. If we don't sell it at the Quilt Show it will be donated. Boutique Items may be returned to the maker if your name and a list of your items is provided.

Your donated items must be clean and saleable! Please no dirt, pet hair, cobwebs, etc. Please donate quilting and sewing related items only, we are not a garage sale and will dispose of any inappropriate items that are donated.

All money made at the Country Store goes to our Guild to pay for our programs and guest speakers. Your donation will directly impact the quality of programs we have in the future. Thank you all for your continued support.

Welcome everyone to our 2022 HIVE! We have exciting lessons planned for this year, and all members are encouraged to come and learn. We meet on the second Thursday at 12:30 just after each guild meeting in the building behind the church.

At the January HIVE you will be making my versatile pillowcases / drawstring bags (pictured below). I would like to donate these pillowcases to children in crisis, mainly those in the foster care system, in the Tyler area. Many times when these kids have to relocate they must take their belongings with them in a garbage bag. But these pillowcases will serve a dual purpose and give them something useful that will belong only to them.

Fabric kits will be provided by the Cuddle Quilts group, so you just need to bring the following supplies:

Sewing machine

Cutting mat, rotary cutter, rulers

Iron and ironing surface (there are two provided that you can share)

Several different colors of thread

Flathead pins

Any other normal sewing supplies

Please click on this link ([here](#)) to find the instructions for the pillowcase on our website. It sounds more complicated than it is, so be sure and come watch my demonstration.

The February HIVE is one that I hope you all will attend so your quilts can be ready for the upcoming quilt show. I will be teaching easy and accurate Machine Binding, and how to add a Hanging Sleeve to your quilts. You should bring a 20" x 20" quilt sandwich to practice your binding and sleeve on. More instructions and supplies will be listed in next month's newsletter. (Sleeve instructions are currently listed on our guild website qgetx.com.)
