

HOW TO MAKE A SLEEVE

Cut the fabric eight and one half inches (8 ½") wide by the width of the quilt. Put a one half inch (1/2") hem in each short end. Fold the piece lengthwise right sides together and sew the long raw edges together with a quarter inch seam. Turn right side out and press with the seam near the bottom. The sleeve width is approximately four inches (4").

If quilt **length is greater than 90 inches** the sleeve top must be **placed 90 inches from the bottom edge** of the quilt.

Stitch the top and bottom of the sleeve to the top back of the quilt. Be sure to sew the back of the hemmed ends of your sleeve to the quilt.

If the quilt is less than 36" in width:

Cut the fabric four and one half inches (4 ½") wide by the width of the quilt. Put a one half inch (1/2") hem in each short end. Fold the piece lengthwise right sides together and sew the long raw edges together with a quarter inch seam. Turn right side out and press with the seam near the bottom. The sleeve width is approximately two inches (2").

Stitch the top and bottom of the sleeve to the top back of the quilt. Be sure to sew the back of the hemmed ends of your sleeve to the quilt.
